September 2024

First Grade

In math we are learning about ways to make numbers through 10. Students are using manipulatives to practice these skill and having fun/1 We are looking forward to beginning our fall Apple Unit and preparing to go to the Pumpkin Patch in October!

Second Grade

Second Graders are off to a busy start! We have already been on a field trip to kick off our Social Studies Unit about the United States of America. (Pictures were shared on Facebook.) In reading, we are working on how to locate information in the text to answer questions from the story. We will be doing cold read comprehension tests on our own beginning the second nine weeks of school, so we are practicing each week to get ready. In math, we have been improving our skills of addition and subtraction within 20. We are currently working on arrays and repeated addition. Second grade is so fun!

Third Grade

We have had a great start to the school year in third grade so far! For each Lesson in Reading, students will receive a newsletter that has all of the skills we are focusing on, including spelling words and vocabulary words. Please study these each night and be aware of test dates. Each student is responsible for writing homework and test dates in their planners each day. Planners and Chromebooks go home and come back to school each day. Please charge Chromebooks each night because we use them in class every day. In Reading, we will be continuing Unit 1 lessons, focusing on comprehension skills, such as Cause and Effect, Fact and Opinion, and Main Idea and Key Details. In math, we will be continuing Topics 3 and 4, focusing on Multiplication and Division. Thank you for continuing to work with your children. We've had a fantastic start to our 2024-2025 school year. We'd like to thank parents for getting all paperwork, supplies, and supply money turned in so quickly.




